New Umpire Guidelines

Umpires are an integral part of the Richmond City Baseball Association (RCBA). All guidelines and policies on providing a safe, fair, and fun environment for players <u>also applies to our umpires</u>.



Even Calvin and Hobbes have close calls!

RCBA would like to make clear that <u>abuse of any umpire is unacceptable</u>, and coaches, managers, players, and spectators may be subject to sanctions as outlined by both RCBA and BC Minor Baseball Association (BCMBA) discipline policy.

This is <u>not</u> intended to imply that the umpire is always right, and the spectator, coach or player is always wrong. We must simply remember that just as players and coaches will make mistakes during play, umpires will also make mistakes in officiating, particularly in the younger divisions where they are learning how to umpire.

We love hearing lots of cheering from our spectators, but any negative comments will not be tolerated. The best thing to do is place yourself in the umpire's position. Have you ever officiated a game, and if so, have made an incorrect call or a call you are unsure of? Just like hitting a baseball or throwing a strike, umpiring may look easy when watching it but it's a very difficult job.
